Dear Parents and Guardians,

Unfortunately, I am writing to inform you that two unrelated individuals in the district (one in each school) have now tested positive for Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19). Below are the details.

- Lincoln Elementary School--Please be advised this individual has not been in the building for formal instruction this current school year, and thus, no quarantining for this case will be required for any other staff or students. As a result, this building will remain open with our current hybrid model in place.
- Thomas Jefferson School-- Please be advised this individual has not been in the building since October 22nd, and thus, no quarantining for this case will be required for any other staff or students, except for the diagnosed person. As a result, this building will also remain open with our current hybrid model in place.

The district is coordinating closely with public health officials and following CDC, state and local health department guidance in order to assure the health and safety of our community. People or individuals outside of school who had contact with these individuals will or have been called directly by the Department of Health and may be advised to self-quarantine, and possibly learn remotely.

Please know that the cleaning and disinfecting of the entire building will continue as per outlined in our district Restart and Re-entry Plan. The school is also taking extra precautions to prevent the introduction and spread of viruses and other germs and is continuing to clean frequently touched surfaces daily. The status of the situation is fluid, and we are continuing to monitor it closely.

We understand the level of concern regarding a positive case in the district. At the same time, we encourage parents and students to continue following the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention promoted safeguards, such as:

- Staying home when you are sick;
- Washing hands often with soap for at least 20 seconds;
- Covering coughs and sneezes properly and disposing of tissues;
- Limiting close contact with people who are sick and not sharing food, drinks or utensils;
- Practicing social distancing and staying 6 feet apart when possible;
- Wearing a face covering while at school;
- Continuing to monitor your health for targeted symptoms.

As always, we appreciate our community's support and cooperation. You can assist us by remaining vigilant, but sensible in your approach to dealing with this health concern. Should you have any questions, please feel to reach out to your school nurse for medical concerns or your building principal for administrative issues.
