- **A**. Mrs. Sherry Rich, a former 4th-grade teacher residing at 31 Ann Street in Rockaway Borough, read a statement to the Board regarding her \$12,500 sick-day payout.
- **B**. Mr. Michael Onischuk, pe teacher, residing at 7 Gerald Place, Rockaway Twsp., supported Mrs. Rich.
- C. Mrs. Mary Leslie, preschool teacher, residing at 68 Hemlock Road, Rockaway Borough, supported Mrs. Rich.
- D. Mr. Nick Bova, music teacher, residing at 6 John Street, Pine Brook, also supported Mrs. Rich.

Background: Mrs. Rich retired on December 31, 2024, and was eligible to receive payment for unused sick days according to the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA). Article XI, "Sick Leave," paragraph C.4, states: "In either case... severance payment shall be made no later than July 31 following the school year in which the employee retires..." All sick-day payouts would normally be paid by July 31, in full compliance with the CBA. In July 2024, the SBA offered her the option to receive the payout earlier as a professional courtesy, recognizing her 30 years of teaching in the district, which she accepted for January 15, 2025. In September 2024, the district experienced an unexpected influx of 25 new students, some of whom required expensive special education placements outside of the district, resulting in new unbudgeted mandated costs of half a million dollars (\$500,000) to provide their educational programs. The budget underwent significant reallocations to prioritize the needs of the new students, and the payout had to be postponed, along with other discretionary items. Consequently, the SBA regrettably informed Mrs. Rich of the unfortunate financial situation and that her payout would be delayed a few months. He stated that if funds became available toward the end of the school year (May/June), he would process her payment well before the July 31 deadline in the CBA. Mrs. Rich insisted that, according to Article XI of the CBA, payment was due immediately (albeit incorrectly). The justifications for the payment delay were unacceptable to her, which led to her appearance and statement to the Board.
