Be it resolved, based on the recommendation of the Superintendent, to approve the attached list of Staff Member **Professional Development Workshops & Travel Expenditure Requests** that have been deemed related to and within the scope of the employee's current job responsibilities and will enhance the efficient delivery of student instruction and/or furthers the efficient operation of the school district. Reimbursements listed are in accordance with guidelines established by the Dept. of Treasury, BOE Policy, and in accordance with NJAC 6A:23B-1.1., and listed at the end of this agenda.
- B. Be it resolved, based upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, to approve an employment contract for **Jennifer Bills**, as a Non-Tenure track Leave of Absence Teacher at Thomas Jefferson School, beginning November 13, 2024, through January 10, 2025. Mrs. Bills will be paid based on Guide-Step BA-1 with an annual salary of \$57,135 (to be prorated from the start date). Mrs. Bills will return to her district paraprofessional position upon completion of the leave of absence contract. Mrs. Bills has completed all required background checks.
- C. Be it resolved, based upon the recommendation of the Superintendent to approve additional instructional class periods for **Jennifer Bills** at an amount of \$52.90 per additional period (one per day) for the 2024/2025 school year (11/13/24 through 1/10/2025, to be paid via timesheet.
- D. Be it resolved, based upon the recommendation of the Superintendent to approve a contract extension for **Neal Healy**, as a Leave Replacement Substitute Teacher at Thomas Jefferson School, from November 12, 2024, to an end date of November 15, 2024. His position was originally approved at the October 16, 2024 board meeting. Mr. Healy has completed all required background checks.
- E. Be it resolved, based upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, to approve the staff assignment transfer for **Mihaela Tuluca** to Thomas Jefferson School as a 4th grade English Language Arts (ELA) teacher for the 2025-2026 school year.

- F. Be it resolved, based upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, to approve **Anna Pratt** as a Substitute Teacher for the 2024-2025 school year at a rate of \$115 per day. Ms. Pratt has successfully completed all required background checks.

Be it resolved to approve a Special Education Tuition Contract with an Approved Private School for Students with Disabilities (APSSD): The Windsor Learning Center, of Pompton Plains, for student number 17180348, at a tentative tuition rate of \$354.82 per day, effective November 18 to June 30, 2025, for a total of 133 school days for a pro-rated cost of \$47,191.06. Transportation is to be arranged through the Morris County Education Services Commission with an estimated cost of \$9,030.
